

Recycling makes a difference



It's better for the environment -

Top 5 Recycling Tips

1) No

No Styrofoam™

Styrofoam™ is not accepted in your recycling program. Place in garbage.



(2)

Cartons & cups are containers.

Paper coffee cups, fountain drink cups, milk/juice cartons and boxes belong in the Containers Bin. Remove plastic lids from cups first, and place both in with Containers.

(3)

Flatten all boxes.

Flatten all types of boxes and bundle or place in Blue Box. Unflattened boxes will be left at the curb.

4 No

No plastic bags.

Please, no plastic bags in the Blue Box. At the recycling centre, they get wound in machines and result in costly maintenance. Please reduce, or recycle them at a retail bin.



Recycle as much as you can!

The average household only recycles 70% of what they can. Make a difference – recycle 100%!







Use two Blue Boxes



Paper



Magazines, catalogues, phone books, soft & hard cover books (remove hard covers)



Household paper



Boxes, egg cartons, tubes (flatten)



Cardboard boxes: Flatten & place large pieces between Blue Boxes. Bundle large quantities in stacks no larger than 75 cm x 75 cm x 20 cm (30" x 30" x 8")

No wrapping paper




Newspapers, flyers

Plastic clamshell containers (No Styrofoam™)



Steel & aluminum cans, metal paint cans (empty), aluminum foil and pie plates



Spiral wound (cardboard) cans



Glass bottles & jars



Ice cream tubs



Plastic bottles, tubs, jugs



Rigid plastic (remove the paper inserts)



Paper cups (separate lids)
