



Prescribed Acceptable Identification Documents

The following is prescribed as the proof of identity and residence that a person may present for the purposes of paragraph 1 of subsection 52 (1) of the Act:

1. An original, or a certified or notarial copy, of a document that is listed in Schedule 1 and shows the person's name and qualifying address. O. Reg. 304/13, s. 1; O. Reg. 151/18, s. 1.

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2. An Ontario driver's licence.
3. An Ontario Health Card (photo card).
4. An Ontario Photo Card.
5. An Ontario motor vehicle permit (vehicle portion).
6. A cancelled personalized cheque.
7. A mortgage statement, lease or rental agreement relating to property in Ontario.
8. An insurance policy or insurance statement.
9. A loan agreement or other financial agreement with a financial institution.
10. A document issued or certified by a court in Ontario.
11. Any other document from the government of Canada, Ontario or a municipality in Ontario or from an agency of such a government.
12. Any document from a Band Council in Ontario established under the Indian Act (Canada).
13. An income tax assessment notice.
14. A Child Tax Benefit Statement.
15. A Statement of Employment Insurance Benefits Paid T4E.
16. A Statement of Old Age Security T4A (OAS).
17. A Statement of Canada Pension Plan Benefits T4A (P).
18. A Canada Pension Plan Statement of Contributions.
19. A Statement of Direct Deposit for Ontario Works.
20. A Statement of Direct Deposit for Ontario Disability Support Program.
21. A Workplace Safety and Insurance Board Statement of Benefits T5007.
22. A property tax assessment.

23. A credit card statement, bank account statement, or RRSP, RRIF, RHOSP or T5 statement.
24. A CNIB Card or a card from another registered charitable organization that provides services to persons with disabilities.
25. A hospital card or record.
26. A document showing campus residence, issued by the office or officials responsible for student residence at a post-secondary institution.
27. A document showing residence at a long-term care home under the Fixing Long-Term Care Act, 2021, issued by the Administrator for the home.
28. A utility bill for hydro, water, gas, telephone or cable TV or a bill from a public utilities commission.
29. A cheque stub, T4 statement or pay receipt issued by an employer.
30. A transcript or report card from a post-secondary school.

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
